Toby Jones brings St Cuthbert to Durham in Benjamin Myers' Cuddy

Durham Book Festival in partnership with Live Theatre present a world-exclusive dramatic live reading from Benjamin Myers' acclaimed novel, *Cuddy*, performed by the award-winning stage and screen actor Toby Jones alongside actress and writer Samantha Neale (Sunday 15 October, Gala Durham).

Toby Jones is well known for his roles in popular film series *The Hunger Games*, *Captain America* and *Harry Potter*, and television series including *The Detectorists* and *Sherlock*. In 2020, he was nominated for an Olivier Award for his role in *Uncle Vanya* at The Harold Pinter Theatre.

Cuddy (Bloomsbury, 2023) is the boldly experimental new novel from Benjamin Myers, the Durham-born author of *The Gallows Pole*, *The Perfect Golden Circle*, and *The Offing. Cuddy* is on the shortlist for the Goldsmiths Prize 2023.

The novel evokes the spirit of St Cuthbert and traces the stories of ordinary people connected over 1,500 years to Cuthbert's final resting place in Durham Cathedral.

For one performance only, Toby Jones will bring to life the voice of Cuthbert, the unofficial patron saint of the North of England.

This Durham Book Festival commission is directed by Jack McNamara in partnership with Live Theatre, with music from The Shining Levels.

Durham Book Festival is a Durham County Council festival produced by New Writing North with support from Durham University and Arts Council England. New Writing North leads the development of creative writing and reading in the North of England, identifying talent, creating career-changing opportunities and ensuring excellent writing finds great audiences.

Durham Book Festival takes place 13-15 October in central Durham and livestreamed, presenting 35 events with 40 authors over a long weekend. Other festival highlights include Jeanette Winterson, Janina Ramirez, Grace Dent, Zaffar Kunial, Melanie Sykes, Ruth Ware, Chris Mullin and Sebastian Payne.

Benjamin Myers said: "To be able to bring my literary interpretation of the life and legacy of St Cuthbert back to the very cobbled streets on which the novel is set feels like an achievement, but to have one of the greatest and most versatile actors of his generation deliver it is beyond a dream come true. As a producer of new work, New Writing North commissions a wide range of writing from topical essays and publications to award-winning dance theatre productions, short films, live literature and broadcast projects.


